## **MONOHYDROCALCITE**

CaCO<sub>3</sub>•H<sub>2</sub>O

Monohydrocalcite is a relatively uncommon mineral formed in freshwater deposits, usually under mildly alkaline conditions. Some deposits may be of biogenic origin. Northern Peninsula.

Marquette County: Presque Isle, Marquette: As relatively thick, massive, chalky white coatings on calcite crystals. Verified by X-ray diffraction. This is the first reported occurrence of monohydrocalcite from Michigan.
