## **SYLVITE**

**KC1** 

A mineral of potash-rich evaporite deposits. Southern Peninsula.

**Newaygo County:** Reported as an accessory mineral from a core penetrating the Salina Group (Dellwig and Briggs, 1953).

**Midland County:** Bedded "sylvinite" (a mixture of sylvite and halite) has been found in a well core at Midland, between 8,287 and 8,392 feet. K<sub>2</sub>O values ranged from <0.5% to >40%. The interval from 8,295 to 8,387 feet is estimated to average 4% K<sub>2</sub>O. The sylvite is restricted to the basal salt member (A-1 salt) of the Salina Group. Geological and geochemical evidence suggest that potash salts underlie about 34,000 square kilometers of the Michigan Basin (Anderson and Egelson, 1970, 1973; Matthews, 1970).

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
